### **Guidelines and Principles for Track and Field Licensing 2019**

The nature of granting authority to promote track and field competitions has changed significantly since the permitting process was introduced in 2011. More recently the process has been reviewed and changes introduced for the 2018 Outdoor season that continue unchanged into 2019. Licence applications will be approved in line with the published fixture calendar and clear clashes of interest will be avoided.

Significant issues to note include:

- The safety of all participants is of paramount importance, and from 2019 UKA will introduce new criteria that specifies that all licence level 2 events must be held at venues that have achieved the relevant TrackMark facility units. For further information on UKA's TrackMark Facility accreditation scheme visit: <https://www.uka.org.uk/governance/facilities/> *Note: From April 2020 the achievement of relevant TrackMark units will apply to ALL levels of competition (i.e. Licence Levels 1 and 2).*
- Subject to Board approval in October 2018, from the 4<sup>th</sup> April 2020 all Licence level 2 competitions involving Hammer, Discus or Weight Throw must take place at a venue with a throws cage that meets the intent of the IAAF specification (i.e. a cage(s) with a hammer danger zone of no more than 56° and a discus danger zone of no more than 75°). - Level 1 licences will be issued by the four National Associations and Level 2 by UKA.
- Licence applications must be submitted at least 8 weeks prior to the event,
- Online post-event reporting will be introduced following a pilot to be conducted in Scotland

The following conditions will continue to apply:

- Competitions must be delivered under UKA Rules for Competition or IAAF Rules.
- The competition must meet the criteria as per the level assigned to it.
- All Results, in the appropriate format, must be sent directly to Power of 10 as agreed by UKA and the Home Country.
- All events applied for within the competition Licence Application Form, must correspond with the specific UKA Rules for each age group.
- All UK Stadia will, as per UKA's requirements, require evidence that the Competition Provider has been awarded the relevant Licence. Please note that this information has been sent to the Competition Venues.
- Events seeking IPC accreditation must meet all Level 2 Licence requirements.

Competitions should provide appropriate opportunities that complement the long-term development of all athletes regardless of age and ability. When organising any competition, the provider should consider whether the format is appropriate for the age and ability of the athlete.

The relationship between Power of Ten and the licensing process has been established and strengthened to the point where Power of Ten will accept athletes' performances at licensed events, but results may be questioned where apparent discrepancies occur. Event Organisers may be contacted to verify details, including the number and levels of Officials on duty, as part of "spot check" exercise. In such circumstances where an event has not been delivered to the standard indicated in the licence application the licence may be withdrawn retrospectively. Licences will not be issued retrospectively and any unlicensed event submitting results to Power of Ten will be required to present full details of the event and the Officials on duty.

Two appendices at the end of this document show the criteria that will be applied when determining the level of a licence and which level an event will allocated if criteria are achieved.

Licences will not be issued until all matters have been resolved. If there are any outstanding issues, the date is not awarded until you receive the licence. Dates agreed through the annual Fixture Planning process will take precedence in all cases.

Please do not hesitate to contact me for any further clarification you may require and again, may I take this opportunity to thank you for your cooperation. It is essential that we work together to create a competition pathway which demonstrates that we have the welfare of the athletes at the centre of our decision making in relation to fixture and pathway planning.

#### Notes

- Licences at Level 2 will only be issued if all requirements are achieved
- The level of licence is determined by the resources available at the event rather than the event title: inclusion of the term “Championship” will not grant automatic Level 2.
- The criteria shown in the table will be applied to licence applications. Other duties will be required dependent on the event, eg Call Room, Technical Information Centre, Announcers, Seeders, but will not be a factor in the licence application.
- The number of qualified Officials recommended at the various levels is always a subject for debate given that the nature of events can vary so much. The basic objective is that published results can be guaranteed to be accurate and confirmed by suitably qualified Officials.
- The numbers of Officials at British Championship and televised events are not included as that will be determined by the event requirements
- Other Officials levels shown are a minimum requirement.
- Referees and Chiefs appointed at Licence level 1 must be at minimum Level 2.
- Referees and Chiefs appointed at Licence level 2 must be at minimum Level 3 with other lead Officials at minimum Level 3.
- TrackMark will be compulsory for a licence at Level 2 and licences awarded only where the specific TrackMark unit(s) is (are) in place.
