Selection Policy – published February 2019

This Selection Policy ("the Selection Policy") has been created in line with British Athletics' strategic aim of winning medals at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games and beyond. The Selection Policy has therefore been structured to select a team with the following aims:

- Medal success at the 2019 WPA Championships; and
- Opportunities for athletes demonstrating rapid progression and strong medal potential for Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

SECTION 1: SELECTION PROCESS

Eligibility

1.1 To be considered for selection, athletes must satisfy each of the following:

- a. Be eligible to compete for GB&NI (i.e. full British passport holder);
- b. Hold an active World Para Athletics License, valid for the 2019 calendar year;
- c. Subject to the "Note" in italics below this paragraph 1.1, by midnight on 15th September 2019 hold either a World Para Athletics ("WPA") "Review", "Fixed Review" or "Confirmed" Classification or a British Athletics National Classification in an eligible class (as listed in the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme);
- d. For athletes who possess a WPA or British Athletics National classification, any such classification must also be underpinned by a Relevant Diagnosis (as defined in paragraph 1.2 below) which is to the satisfaction of the British Athletics Chief Medical Officer ("the CMO") in accordance with paragraph 1.2. For the avoidance of doubt, these requirements apply to all athletes seeking selection under this Selection Policy, including those with a physical, visual or intellectual impairment;
- e. Be 14 years or older as at 31st December 2019;
- f. Have achieved at least one Minimum Entry Standard ("MES") performance (see Appendix A of this Selection Policy) in an event featured on the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme (see [WPA Website](#) for the full Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme), in accordance with paragraphs 2.1 to 2.17 below; and
- g. Sign the British Athletics Team Members' Agreement ("TMA") and abide by its terms and conditions. Any athlete failing to do so prior to the first date of competition will result in their selection being withdrawn. The current version of the TMA can be found online at <https://www.uka.org.uk/performance/british-athletics-teams-information/>

Note: For the avoidance of doubt, RR3 100m events are not currently on the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme. However, British Athletics are committed to supporting the development of Race Running as a discipline within the WPA Championships. As such, RR2 and RR3 class athletes will be considered eligible for selection in the RR3 100m events in the same way as those athletes competing in events in the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme. RR2 and RR3 athletes must hold a CPISRA "Review" or "Fixed Review" classification by 15th September 2019. Please note, athletes in ALL other events, must still satisfy paragraph 1.1 (c) in holding WPA or British Athletics National Classification in an eligible class and 1.1 (f) if competing in a primary event that features on the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme.

Relevant Diagnosis

1.2 The CMO must be satisfied of any medical diagnosis that underpins an athlete's classification (such a diagnosis being a "Relevant Diagnosis") and must be satisfied that the impairment diagnosed causes permanent and verifiable physical, visual or intellectual activity limitation consistent with the athlete's classification. The following provisions shall apply in connection with the CMO's assessment of a Relevant Diagnosis:

- a. it shall be the responsibility of the athlete to obtain and provide documentary evidence of a Relevant Diagnosis so as to show to the CMO's satisfaction that the impairment causes permanent and verifiable physical, visual or intellectual activity limitation consistent with the athlete's classification;
- b. the athlete shall comply with all reasonable requests of the CMO for further evidence of the Relevant Diagnosis, and the costs of obtaining such evidence shall be met by British Athletics; and
- c. all documentary evidence submitted in support of a Relevant Diagnosis must be in English, dated and signed by a registered medical professional who provided the diagnosis.

Selection Meeting

1.3 The team will be selected on **16th September 2019**.

1.4 The team will be announced on **18th September 2019**.

1.5 The Selection Panel ("the Panel") for the meeting shall comprise:

- a. Voting members;
 - i. British Athletics' Paralympic Head Coach;
 - ii. British Athletics' Paralympic Podium Potential Manager; and
 - iii. Event group representatives as nominated by the Head Coach and Podium Potential Manager.
- b. Non-voting members:
 - i. British Athletics' Paralympic Performance Programme Manager (who will chair the meeting);
 - ii. At least one independent observer;
 - iii. Athlete Commission Member;

- iv. British Athletics' Chief Medical Officer ("the CMO") or medical representative, as nominated by the CMO;
 - v. Statistician;
 - vi. Media representative; and
 - vii. Note-takers etc. as required.
- 1.6 For all events excluding Race Running, the Panel will select a maximum of 40 athletes in rounds 1-3 (outlined in paragraphs 1.8 to 1.10), subject to the conditions outlined in paragraphs 2.1 – 2.17.
- 1.7 For Race Running events, the Panel will select a maximum of 4 additional athletes in round 5 (outlined in paragraph 1.12).
- 1.8 Round 1 – top ranked
- a. Eligible athletes who are ranked in the top three (3) of individual 2019 WPA Championships MES Rankings for an event at 09:00 (BST) on 16th September 2019 and have achieved a MES in the same event will be automatically selected for that same event, provided they have demonstrated current form and fitness during the 2019 calendar year. The following exceptions apply:
 - i. Athletes competing in "weak" events (i.e. events in which the 2019 WPA Championships MES Rankings contain less than eight (8) athletes or there are less than three (3) countries represented in those Rankings), will NOT be automatically selected. They will instead be considered in round 2 (paragraph 1.9);
 - ii. If the total number of selectable athletes in round 1 exceeds the maximum of 40, the factors listed in paragraph 1.9.c. will be used to determine which athletes are selected.
- 1.9 Round 2 – remaining eligible individual athletes:
- a. Athletes will only be selected for individual events in this round if:
 - i. they have achieved at least one "MES" performance in the same event, and the event is featured on the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme; and
 - ii. they have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Panel, current form and fitness which suggests they have realistic potential to finish in the top eight (8) at the 2019 World Para Athletics Championships AND go on to win a medal at Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.
 - b. All athletes who have achieved an MES will be discussed. Athletes will be discussed in order of the 2019 WPA Championship MES qualification ranking but, for the avoidance of doubt, selections will not necessarily be made in order of rankings.
 - c. Athletes will be selected based on the following (and any other factors deemed relevant):
 - i. 2019 WPA Championship MES Rankings;
 - ii. Number of times MES have been achieved;
 - iii. WPA 2019 World Rankings;
 - iv. Current form and fitness;
 - v. Performances in non-WPA approved competitions (results submitted to Powerof10);
 - vi. Record at previous major senior championships (2017 World Para Athletics Championships, 2016 Rio Paralympic Games);

- vii. Performance-limiting injury or illness;
- viii. The relative strength of an event/class at previous Paralympic Games and World Championships;
- ix. Athlete head-to-heads; and
- x. Tokyo 2020 potential, including likelihood of an athlete's primary event featuring in the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme (available online at the [WPA website](#)).

1.10 Round 3 – direct invitations:

- a. In exceptional circumstances, where previous World or Paralympic medallist/s who have demonstrated current form and fitness, have not, in the view of the Panel, had the opportunity to achieve an MES, the Panel may decide at the selection meeting to submit a formal request to WPA for a direct invitation.
- b. WPA has the discretion to directly invite athletes whether on the basis of requests by British Athletics or on its own initiative.
- c. If direct invitations are issued by WPA, these will be considered by the Panel on a case by case basis (which may be on a pre-emptive basis at the selection meeting or at a further meeting, pursuant to paragraph 1.10.e below).
- d. Direct invitations will only be eligible for acceptance if:
 - i. the athlete concerned has demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Panel, current form and fitness which suggests they have realistic potential to finish in the top eight (8) at the 2019 World Para Athletics Championships AND go on to win a medal at Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games; and
 - ii. the maximum number of GB & NI athletes for the same event (as detailed in paragraphs 1.6 and 1.7) has not already been reached.
- e. Whether any direct invitations are accepted is at the sole discretion of the Panel. The Panel may reach a determination at the selection meeting on 16th September 2019 in respect of those athletes it submits a formal request for or any athletes it considers might receive a direct invitation from WPA on its own initiative. Alternatively, the Panel may convene a further meeting (which may be by telephone conference) in order to determine whether to accept any direct invitations issued.
- f. If the total number of selectable athletes in rounds 1, 2 and 3 exceeds the maximum of 40, the factors listed in paragraph 1.9.c. will be used to prioritise which athletes are selected.

1.11 Round 4 – relays:

- a. A team of up to six (6) athletes may be entered for the 4 x 100m universal relay, but only athletes selected in round 1, 2 or 3 for an individual event/s will be considered for selection.
- b. The team must consist of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes.
- c. The following classes are eligible for each leg:
 - i. First leg: T11, T12 or T13;
 - ii. Second leg: T42, T43, T44, T45, T46, T47, T61, T62, T63 or T64;
 - iii. Third leg: T35, T36, T37 or T38; and
 - iv. Fourth leg: T33, T34, T51, T52, T53 or T54.
- d. A relay team (including additional relay team members) will only be selected if the Panel believe the athletes already selected for individual events are those who would realistically combine to contend for a relay medal in Tokyo.
- e. Athletes will be considered for selection based on the following:
 - i. WPA rules regarding classification/discipline combinations;
 - ii. Current form and fitness;

- iii. Head-to-heads;
- iv. Previous major competition history;
- v. Injury status; and
- vi. Engagement with the British Athletics relay programme.

1.12 Round 5 – Race Running:

- a. The Panel will select up to two (2) male and two (2) female athletes from eligible RR2 and RR3 athletes to compete in RR3 100m.
- b. Athletes will be selected based on the following (and any other factors deemed relevant):
 - i. Individual 2019 WPA Championships MES Rankings;
 - ii. Current form and fitness;
 - iii. Performances in non-WPA approved competitions (results submitted to Powerof10);
 - iv. Performance-limiting injury or illness; and
 - v. Athlete head-to-heads.

1.13 Round 6 – doubling up:

- a. The Panel may allow an athlete already selected in one individual event to be selected for additional individual events (including events not on the Para Athletics Tokyo 2020 Medal Event Programme) after the conclusion of all previous rounds, provided the athlete meets the qualification conditions set out in this Selection Policy (paragraphs 2.1 to 2.17), for the additional event(s).
- b. The Panel cannot, in making selections in this round, override previous selections or preclude another athlete selected in previous rounds.
- c. In making their decision the Panel will consider the following:
 - i. The impact on the athlete's preparation and performance of their primary event;
 - ii. The athlete's ability to finish in the top 8 in their secondary event; and
 - iii. The secondary event as a development opportunity for the athlete.

Note: The criteria outlined above, in rounds 2 – 6 (paragraphs 1.9.c., 1.11.e. and 1.12.b.) are not listed in priority order.

- 1.14 The 2019 WPA Championships Event Programme will be confirmed following close of entries on 1st October 2019. If the structure of any events changes at this stage, for example if classes are combined or events become non-viable, the Panel will reconsider any athletes originally selected in these events. Athletes may be deselected if they are no longer eligible or if the Panel considers (in re-applying the provisions of paragraphs 1.8 to 1.13 above) that they do not meet the selection criteria for the new event.

SECTION 2: PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

Minimum Entry Standards ("MES")

- 2.1 In all track events and single class field events, a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes may be entered per medal event (single class) provided all have achieved at least one (1) valid MES.

- 2.2 In combined field events a maximum of five (5) eligible athletes may be selected, with a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes per single class.
- 2.3 MES must be achieved between 00:00 (GMT) 1st January 2018 and 24:00 (BST) 15th September 2019.

Performance conditions relating to MES performances

- 2.4 MES performances must be achieved in WPA endorsed competitions (see [WPA website](#) for a full list of domestic and overseas WPA endorsed events).
- 2.5 Domestic, non-disabled competitions are not automatically endorsed or recognised by WPA for the purposes of achieving MES performances. Athletes may request WPA endorsement (via British Athletics) for specific domestic non-disabled competitions in accordance with paragraph 2.6 below provided the request satisfies the following:
- The competition is an integrated event – i.e. either disability events take place in the same competition as non-disabled events OR a disabled athlete competes in a non-disabled event directly against non-disabled athletes; and
 - The competition for which endorsement is being sought is a UKA Permit Level 2 or higher competition (for further details on UKA competition permits, please check www.britishathletics.org.uk).
- 2.6 Athletes wishing to request WPA endorsement of a domestic, non-disabled, event must send requests to Jan Richards at jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk, at least four (4) weeks prior to the start of the competition. The final decision as to whether such an event is endorsed shall be at the discretion of WPA.
- 2.7 In order for qualifying performances to be recognised by WPA, athletes must hold a 2019 WPA License at the commencement of the competition in which the performance was achieved. Athletes without a valid WPA license must submit new requests for a license at least one (1) week prior to the commencement of that competition. All requests must be submitted to Jan Richards at jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk.
- 2.8 Wind-assisted performances (or performances achieved in events where wind measurement was not available/recorded) will not be accepted.
- 2.9 Indoor performances for all field events and all track events of 400m or longer will be accepted.
- 2.10 Hand timed performances in 100m, 200m & 400m will not be accepted.
- 2.11 Field event performances must be achieved using implements with a "minimum" weight, as outlined per classification (see [WPA website](#) for implement weights).
- 2.12 For the running events of 400m and over, performances achieved on oversized tracks will NOT be accepted.
- 2.13 100m, 200m and 400m performances at altitudes of above 950m will not be accepted.
- 2.14 Performances achieved in mixed events between male and female participants, held completely in a stadium, shall not normally be accepted. Exceptions to this rule may be

made for field events or races of 5,000m or longer provided the stipulations outlined in WPA rule 3.2.5 (including notes) are satisfied. For the avoidance of doubt, where any mixed gender race is conducted so as to allow athletes of one gender to be paced/drafted/assisted by athletes of another gender, the results will not be permissible for qualification/selection purposes. Whether or not a mixed gender race has been conducted in such a way will be determined at the absolute discretion of the Panel.

- 2.15 Multiple performances achieved in the same individual event in a single day will count as follows:
- a. In track events only the fastest legal result of the day;
 - b. In throwing events only the best trial of the first competition of the day; and
 - c. In horizontal jumps only the best trial of the first competition of the day, unless every mark achieved by the athlete was wind-assisted (or the wind measurement was not available/recorded) in which case a second competition held under non-wind-assisted conditions will count.

World ranking conditions relating to selection

- 2.16 For events in which more than one class is eligible (such as F42/61/63 Shot Put), the combined WPA MES Ranking (based on unadjusted times/distances) will always be used for the purposes of the selection process.
- 2.17 2019 WPA Championships MES Rankings will be taken at 09:00 (BST) on 16th September 2019. If the 2019 WPA Championships MES Rankings are known by the Head Coach to be inaccurate (i.e. missing performances) at this point, British Athletics will manually input any missing results from the data set obtained from WPA. The data used during the selection process will be made available for any subsequent appeals.

SECTION 3: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Appeals

- 3.1 Athletes may appeal their non-selection, but only after the relevant final selection date in accordance with the procedure laid out in the "British Athletics Selection Appeals Policy" ("the Fast Appeals Process", located on the UKA website). Athletes wishing to seek advice regarding the appeals process (including the validity of any procedure itself) are advised to contact the UK Athletics Athletes' Commission at www.uka.org.uk/governance/uk-athletics-athletes-commission/.
- 3.2 For the avoidance of doubt, in the event of a successful appeal pursuant to the Fast Appeals Process, the following consequences may apply:
- a. the Appeal Panel may confirm the selection of the appellant athlete under clause 8.1 of the Fast Appeals Process and athlete(s) previously selected may be deselected at the Appeal Panel's insistence;
 - b. the Appeal Panel may remit the matter back to the Selection Panel under clause 8.3 of the Fast Appeals Process and a new decision will be made in accordance

with this Selection Policy, which may (if the appellant athlete is subsequently selected) result in the deselection of athlete(s) previously selected at the first selection meeting; or

- c. (subject to there being sufficient available places on the team) in the event that the Appeal Panel confirms the selection of the appellant athlete under clause 8.1 of the Fast Appeals Process or the Selection Panel concludes that the appellant athlete should be selected after reconsidering the matter pursuant to clause 8.3 of the Fast Appeals Process, the appellant athlete may be added to the team with no deselections taking place.

Amendment

- 3.3 British Athletics reserves the right to amend this Selection Policy at its sole discretion and will make any amended version publicly available (including the date on which any amendment was made) at www.uka.org.uk.
